Please ensure your child/ren attends school every day, unless they are too poorly to do so. #### **Punctuality is equally important:**

Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year = 20 lessons missed. Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to 2 weeks absence a year = 55 lessons missed. Arriving 25 minutes late every adds up to 19 days absence a year = 123 lessons missed

## **School Meals Price Increase**

From September 2025, the price of a school meal will increase to £2.75 per day.

For those of you who pay weekly, it will be £13.75 for a 5 day week.

# **Message from Cheshire Fire and Rescue**

Vital water safety message ahead of the summer holidays:

With warmer weather on the way, it's important to remind children of the dangers of swimming or playing in and around water. Statistics show that drownings are three times more likely on hot days, as more people look to cool off.

#### Stay safe this summer

Whether you're staying at home or going on holiday this summer, make sure you are being safe in and around the water.

#### What to do if you see someone in trouble

**Shout** – "Are you in trouble? Can you swim towards me, or stand up?"

**Reach** – find a long object that you can let go of, to try and reach the person. Lie down or crouch so you aren't pulled in too.

**Throw** – throw something to help keep them afloat - throwlines (floating lines), footballs, and life rings are great options.

**Don't go** – Never go into the water yourself; keep eyes on them and call 999 immediately. **If you're in trouble, Float to Live -** lie on your back, keeping your mouth above the surface, and try to gently

move to safety. Stay calm.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Measles is on the increase in Cheshire & Merseyside – make sure your child has received two doses of the Measles, Mumps, & Rubella (MMR) vaccine for full protection.

Measles is an infection that spreads very easily. It can cause serious illness in some people and in rare cases, spread to the lungs or the brain. Babies and pregnant women are at increased risk of harm. Having two doses of the MMR vaccine is the best way to prevent measles.

Measles usually starts with a runny nose, sneezing, coughing, and a high temperature. It may cause red, sore eyes. The measles rash will appear a few days later, starting on the face and behind the ears before spreading to the rest of the body. There may be small white spots inside the cheeks.

If you suspect you or your child has measles, phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. Do not go directly to the GP surgery as measles is highly infectious. Do not send children to school or childcare if you think they have measles.

People of any age can become infected with measles if they have not been fully vaccinated. Two doses of the MMR vaccine provides lifelong protection against measles, mumps, and rubella. The MMR vaccine is safe and effective. The first dose is given at the age of 12 months and the 2nd dose is given at 3 years and 4 months old for those born before 1 July 2024, or at 18 months for those born on or after 1 July 2024.




